Building skills and knowledge is at the heart of what we do

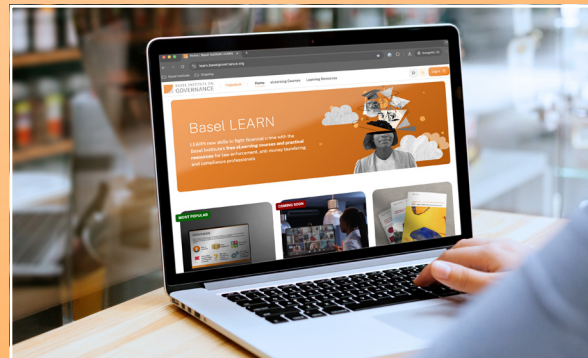
Our **hands-on training for government agencies**, our **eLearning courses** and our **academic teaching** empower professionals across sectors and continents.



Basel STUDY

In 2025, we launched two advanced study programmes with the University of Basel, Switzerland. The first of their kind, these six-month courses are designed to equip mid-career professionals and practitioners from all corners of the globe with the tools, skills and networks needed to lead in the fight against corruption and financial crime.

But many of those who would benefit most – particularly those in low-income countries – cannot afford to participate.
