Corruption is used strategically...



to ensure drugs get past container screening and security...



and out of the port without detection.



Increased enforcement efforts and strengthened detection



Traffickers face more obstacles to operating effectively



The need for inside help increases



Corruption becomes even more essential for organised crime



With unchanged demand for drugs and the high profitability of the crime, drug trafficking will not disappear.

Instead, corruption and crime strategies are adapting.

Corruption adapts in the face of strengthened enforcement

Corruption aims and targets shift

Stronger anti-corruption measures are developed

High demand for drugs and increased barriers to drug trafficking

Modes of transport and trafficking routes shift

Trafficking strategies also change

"Risk" of drug trafficking being detected increases

Trafficking concealment strategies change

Trafficking and corruption are typically measured by detection.

Increasingly sophisticated criminal strategies make detection more difficult and can hide what is really happening."

How to deal with the evolving nature of crime?


 Continuously strengthen the ability to recognise "red flags"
